

C. General and Agrometeorological Advisories for Thrissur District

The following are immediate steps to be followed to protect farmers, plants, and birds from the summer heat. Drink plenty of clean water from time to time to prevent dehydration. Avoid going out in hot weather. Thus you can get rid of sunburn. While working in the farm, try to use a hat or an umbrella to prevent direct sunlight. As the climate is hot and dry, irrigate the crops as required to ensure adequate soil moisture. Irrigate only, when there is no strong sunlight. Drip irrigation can reduce water loss to some extent.

Animal Husbandry:- During cloudy condition, avoid bathing the cow and washing the cattle shed, otherwise more heat will be build up. Provide proper air circulation using fans. Assure increased ventilation in the cattle shed. Ensure sufficient supply of clean drinking water to the animals. (CAADECCS, KVASU, Mannuthy).
