Agro Meteorological Advisories:

Crop	Stage of the crop / Pest/Disease	Advisories	
Paddy	Maturity stage	Drain out water from the fields completely for early and uniform	
		hardening of the grain. Keep drying the grains for seed purpose.	
Coconut	Red palm weevil and Rhinoceros beetle	Farmers are advised to keep vigilance against Red palm weevil and Rhinoceros beetle. Inoculation of breeding sites with entomopathogenic fungus Metarrhizium anisopliae (10-15g per litre water). Application of neem cake mixed with equal volume of sand in the innermost leaf axils.	
Banana	Spodoptra	Due to the increase in maximum temperature there is a chance for Spodoptra in banana. Destroy the affected leafs along with the spodoptra. For severe attack spray Fame 2 ml/10 L of water.	
Vegetables (Chilli)	Mite	Due to dry atmospheric condition there may be a chance of mite attack in chilli. Apply Oberon at the rate of 0.75ml per one litre of water.
